Changes in SWSS Committees

The SWSS Board of Directors voted to change the membership criteria of the Long Range Planning Committee. This was done to provide longer terms for committee members. It was felt that the two-year terms did not allow adequate time for the members to effectively identify issues affecting the general health and vitality of the Society, evaluate potential actions, recommend actions, and help implement changes approved by the Board. The Long Range Planning Committee will now be made up of the previous five (5) presidents of the SWSS. The chair will be appointed by the president for a three (3) year term.

Submission of Titles

Title submission for the 2003 annual meeting will be via the SWSS Website. The Title Submission Form and instructions for submission are on the website. All submissions are due September 1, 2002. Programs and instructions for abstracts and papers will be sent to the presenter in November.

Presentation of Papers

ONLY LCD PRESENTATIONS WILL BE USED **DURING THE 2003 SWSS MEETING!**

This is the first meeting in which all volunteered papers will be presented using LCD projectors. The SWSS Board of Directors has receive numerous requests for LCD

presentations over the past few years. This change to LCD presentations will require that presenters follow directions explicitly and may require submission of files to the Program Chairperson before the annual meeting.

LCD Format–The following information is pertinent to LCD presentations for this meeting.

- 1. All presentations **MUST** be in **PowerPoint 97 for** MS Windows (PC compatible). The computers used at the annual meeting will support only the PowerPoint 97 for MS Windows.
- MacIntosh/Apple formats will **NOT** be supported. 2.
- 3. The presentation size should be 25MB or less and audio clips or sounds are NOT allowed. Limit fonts used in the presentation to basic ones such as Times, Arial, Courier or similar equivalents. Not all computers used at the meeting will support all types of fonts.
- 4. Video clips are discouraged. Contact the Program Chair before the meeting if you plan to use a video clip.
- 5. Presentations must be sent to the Program Chair (see below) on a CD-R (not CD-RW).
- Last minute editing will **NOT** be allowed. 6.
- 7. Presenters will **NOT** be allowed to use their computers in the sessions.
- 8. Specific instructions pertaining to when and where to send the CD-R Presentation will be sent to the authors in November.

To be considered, a complete nomination packet (form, photo, and supporting documents as described below) **must be postmarked by September 28, 2002.**

Please nominate a deserving person for one of these awards. If you are unable to access the forms you need from the web site, please contact the subcommittee chairperson for the appropriate award and request a hard copy.

Outstanding Graduate Student Awards

One (1) award is given to a M.S. level student and one (1) is given to a Ph.D. level student who has demonstrated outstanding performance in graduate studies and related weed science activities.

Eligibility Requirements are as follows:

The student:

- Must be enrolled in 2002 as a graduate student in the degree program for which he or she is nominated.
- Must have actively participated in SWSS sponsored activities during the past two years (examples: annual meeting, weed contest, student paper contest, committee work).
- Winners of the M.S. level Outstanding Graduate Student Award are NOT eligible for the Ph.D. level award.

• The packet of completed **nomination materials must be postmarked by September 28, 2002.**

Nomination Materials:

A successful nomination packet will include:

- Name and address of nominee.
- College degree(s): Degree, College or University, Date received or expected.
- Transcripts of college courses; photocopies are acceptable.
- List of publications. Send a reprint of one; do not include papers that were published or submitted for publication past the date of the student's graduation.
- List of special honors or awards.
- List of memberships in professional and honor societies, including committee activities and offices held.
- Thesis outline and brief description of progress to date in reaching the outline goals.
- A 50 to 150 word statement, written by the nominee, describing how the nominee feels he or she could best contribute to the discipline of weed science
- A letter, plus completed evaluation form from:
 - a. the nominator
 - b. one (1) member of the student's advisory committee
 - c. one (1) staff or faculty member not on the student's advisory committee
 - d. one (1) fellow graduate student
 - e. one (1) professional weed scientist not from the nominee's university
- Name and mailing address of two (2) places the nominator or nominee wishes to have notified in the event the nominee is elected to receive the award. (e.g. local newspaper, department chair, supervisors, etc.)
- One (1) black-and-white head and shoulders photograph, approximately 4 by 5 inches, to be used for awards brochure and publicity, if needed (not used in selection process).
- One-page biographical sketch of the nominee, to be used for publicity and awards brochure, if needed (not used in selection process).
- Using the application form as the cover page, send nine (9) copies of the nomination material,

Eligibility Requirements are as follows:

- Must be a voting member of the Society in 2002 (some exceptions may be considered).
- Must have been a voting member of the Society for at least ten (10) years.
- Must have made outstanding contributions to the Society through committee work, elective offices held, initiation of programs, or other contributions that have benefitted the Society and weed science.

Nomination Materials:

A successful nomination packet will include:

- Name and address of nominee
- Description of service to SWSS
- Detail of professional contributions outside weed science
- Explanation of why the nominee is especially qualified to receive the Distinguished Service Award
- List of honors and awards
- List of professional positions held
- Three (3) letters supporting the nomination. Two
 (2) of the letters must be from active members of SWSS.

Outstanding Young Weed Scientist Award

This award is presented annually to a young weed scientist from academia in recognition of outstanding performance in teaching, research, extension, and/or other service to weed science.

Eligibility Requirements are as follows:

- Must have been a voting member of the Society for at least three (3) of the last five (5) years.
- Must be a voting member of the Society during 2002.
- Must be from teaching, research, or extension.
- Must be born on or after January 31, 1962.
- Must have completed at least five (5) years work in weed science other than that related to academic studies.
- Previous recipients of this award are ineligible for renomination

• The packet of completed nomination materials must be postmarked by September 28, 2002.

Nomination Materials:

The successful nomination packet will include:

- A complete vita of the nominee outlining his/her significant contributions to weed science and the Society.
- Letter from the nominating person explaining why the nominee is especially well qualified to receive the award.
- Three (3) letters in support of the nomination. Two (2) letters must be from active members of SWSS. Letters should specifically address the contributions specified above.
- A black-and-white head and shoulder photo, approximately 4 X 5 inches, to be used for awards brochure and publicity, if needed (not used in selection process).
- One-page biographical sketch of the nominee for awards brochure and publicity, if needed (not used selection process).

Weed Scientist of the Year Award

This award is presented annually to a weed scientist from academia, the public sector, or industry and recognizes

outstanding performance in teaching, research, extension, and/or other service to weed science.

Eligibility requirements are as follows:

- Must have been a voting member of the Society for at least five (5) of the last ten (10) years.
- Must be a voting member of the Society in 2002.
- May be from academia, the public sector, or industry.
- Must have completed at least five (5) years work in weed science other than that related to academic studies.
- Previous recipients of this award are ineligible for renomination.
- The packet of completed nomination materials must be postmarked by September 28, 2002.

Nomination Materials:

The successful nomination packet will include:

- Vita of the nominee.
- Summary of nominee's service to SWSS.
- explanation of why the nominee is especially qualified to receive the award.
- Three (3) letters supporting the nomination. Two (2) of the letters must be from active members of SWSS
- One black-and-white head and shoulders photograph, approximately 4 X 5 inches, for awards brochure and publicity, if needed (not used in selection process).

Outstanding Educator Award

This award is presented to a weed scientist in recognition of outstanding contributions to the Society and weed science through education.

Eligibility requirements are as follows:

- Must be a voting member of SWSS in 2002.
- Must be an active member of SWSS during the last five (5) years.
- Previous recipients of this award are ineligible for renomination.
- The packet of completed nomination materials must be postmarked by September 28, 2002.

Nomination Materials:

The successful nomination packet will include:

- List of professional contributions to weed science. Examples: publications (journals, books, book chapters, extension publications), patents, software programs, outreach or public service activities, college courses, short courses, seminars, or workshops taught, student-mentoring activities, presentations at professional meetings, consulting activities, service to professional societies, innovative contributions to education.
- Summary and evaluation of the nominee's significant contributions to weed science and the weed science knowledge base.
- Explanation of why the nominee is especially well qualified to receive the award.
- Three (3) supporting letters, two (2) letters must be from active members of SWSS. Letters should specifically address the contributions to education specified above.
- One black-and-white head and shoulders photograph approximately 4 X 5 inches, for awards brochure and publicity, if needed (not used in selection process).
- One-page biographical sketch of the nominee for awards brochure and publicity, if needed (not used in selection process).
- Using the application form as the cover page, send nine (9) copies of the completed nomination materials, **postmarked by September 28, 2002**, to:


